

Animal telepathic communication

All you need do is be open.....

This is a message from Riff- Raff, a beautiful Siberian husky with piercing green eyes and the character of a wolf. This amazing dog has taught many people how to communicate with animals and hear their answers.

Imagine being able to come home from work, sit in the garden with your animal friends, talk to them, ask them how their day was, and hear their answers. You say impossible. I say absolutely not. Not only do they hear us but also understand far more than we give them credit for.

All animals communicate by sending pictures, feelings and thoughts. Have you ever wondered why when you tell your dog to stop barking, he just carries on? Well, I'm going to tell you why:

By saying the words, STOP BARKING the picture you are creating in your mind is of the dog barking and this is what he is reacting to. He won't hear the word STOP. He will then carry on barking thinking you have given him permission to bark. The better way to handle this is to say, thank you for barking now please keep your mouth closed. You will be acknowledging that he is doing his job and it is now fine to stop.

When your cat is scratching the furniture, you're reaction is to yell and chase him all over the lounge getting more and more frantic. Eventually you catch him, pick him up and throw him outside closing the door. He thinks you are so happy that he is doing what you say and scratching the furniture. Look how excited you are getting. Yippee. You are so pleased with him for listening to you. What a lovely game. Wham, you throw him out and slam the door in a fit of rage. He thinks, "I will never understand these humans. One minute they are playing with me and running all around the lounge getting more and more excited. The next thing I find myself outside all alone. Did I do something wrong?" He will slowly lose his trust in you. Always provide an alternative, for instance, a scratch post. Say to him, this is my furniture please leave it alone and if you feel the need to scratch, here is your scratching post.

Now remember, these are animals you are connecting to and they have their own minds. Think of them as extremely intelligent children. This means that they might not always listen to you. They might be having just too much fun. Don't despair, keep giving them the message and sooner or later they will respond. Because they communicate through pictures, feelings and thoughts, you can also picture them in your mind doing exactly what you want them to do rather than what you don't want them to do. They will eventually get the message. If you see them in your mind being calm and relaxed but you feel anxious because you don't know if they will hear you, they will get confused. The picture you send must match the feelings you put out.

The most frequently asked question. Do animals speak any language? Of course they do. As long as you ask the questions in a language you understand, the animals will understand because they are responding to the pictures the words are forming in your mind. The messages will come back to you in pictures, feelings and thought forms.

One of the best ways to heal the emotional state of any animal is by letting them tell you their side of the story and get it off their chest. This releases all the negativity from their system, preventing disease from manifesting into their physical body.

This form of communication is not restricted to domestic animals alone but is just as effective with wild animals.
